CHURCH ORGAN



As you all are aware, our church organ is no longer working. It cannot be repaired because there are no parts available due to the age of the organ. It is an analog type organ which is now obsolete. This organ was purchased by many generous contributions from parishioners back in 1983. Kyle Medeiros, Director of Music, was able to locate a similar but digital, newer version organ from the same company we purchased our current one as well as the same company that has been servicing this organ. This is a newer used organ but has been completely refurbished and comes with a warranty. The cost for the organ, complete installation and removal of the old organ will be \$32,000. I discussed this with the Parish Council and they all agreed that I pursue permission from the Bishop to purchase this organ using money from our Renovation Account. I asked the Bishop and he has given me permission and I will proceed with the contract to purchase the new organ. Anyone willing to make a donation of any size as a gift or as a memorial in memory of a loved one is asked to do so and will be most welcomed and appreciated. EASTER SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD

First Reading: Acts 10:34a, 37-43

In this passage, Peter testifies that he and his followers saw the miracles performed by Christ, witnessed His death, and believe in His resurrection. Now they will proclaim to all that Christ is the Son of God.

Second Reading: Colossians 3:1-4

Paul tells the Colossians that they will appear with Christ in glory. They should be mindful of things above rather than things on earth.

Gospel: John 20:1-9

In vivid detail, John tells us that when Mary Magdalene visited Christ's tomb, the tomb was empty. She told the apostles, who ran to the tomb, and saw the "wrappings" on the ground. The disciple who entered first "saw and believed."
