PARISH SURVEY UPDATE

The Parish Council and the Survey Task force members met on Monday, March 27th to discuss the survey results of our parish. Overall, we graded in the mid-range in all aspects of the survey. One area that was noted for improving was informing parishioners of the ministries that are offered as well as communications of the daily functions of the parish operations. An idea on how to inform parishioners of the happenings of the parish is to write up brief explanations of the various ministries in our parish. Each Ministry will be highlighted to help inform you of what the parish has to offer. The survey also showed that many parishioners are unaware of the hospitality and welcoming of new members and how the Pastor welcomes them. CHURCH ORGAN

As you all are aware, our church organ is no longer working. It cannot be repaired because there are no parts available due to the age of the organ. It is an analog type organ which is now obsolete. This organ was purchased by many generous contributions from parishioners back in 1983. Kyle Medeiros, Director of Music, was able to locate a similar but digital, newer version organ from the same company we purchased our current one as well as the same company that has been servicing this organ. This is an organ that has been completely refurbished and comes with a warranty. The cost for the organ, complete installation and removal of the old organ will be \$32,000. I discussed this with the Parish Council and they all agreed that I pursue permission from the Bishop to purchase this using money from our Renovation Account. I asked the Bishop and he has given me permission and I will proceed with the contract to purchase the new organ. SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER OR SUNDAY OF DIVINE MERCY

First Reading: Acts 2:42-47

In the early days of the Church in Jerusalem, the faithful listened intently to the teachings of the apostles. They lived a communal life, sharing all property in common and praying and taking their meals together.

Second Reading: 1 Peter 1:3-9

In this first letter from Peter, he speaks to the Christians with great joy and confidence, reminding them that through Christ's resurrection, they have been given a new birth and are heirs to the kingdom of heaven.

Gospel: John 20:19-31

After his resurrection, Jesus appears to his disciples and gives them the power to forgive sins. Thomas, who is absent, sees Christ later and believes in His resurrection after feeling His wounds. Christ admonishes Thomas by saying, "You became a believer because you saw Me. Blessed are they who have not seen and believed."

HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly

Second Sunday of Easter or Sunday of Divine Mercy April 23, 2017

"They devoted themselves to the teaching of the apostles and to the communal life, to the breaking of the bread and to the prayers... All who believed were together and had all things in common... Every day they devoted themselves to meeting together in the temple area and to breaking bread in their homes... and every day the Lord added to their numbers."

Such a description seems 'too good to be true' but this is the description of the first disciples of the Lord. The teaching of the apostles, the kerygma, telling of the resurrection of Jesus and His victory gave their discipleship new meaning. Like a family, they formed a support group, sharing joy, as well as fears, anxieties and triumphs because Christ was alive. The Eucharist became the common bond, uniting them with Christ and one another. Prayer became a binding force.

Can I not see that my life in my parish, my small group, is a mirror of those described by St. Luke or of those gathered in the upper room? Can the presence of Christ in my life, lead me to recognize His presence in others? Can I truly believe that I am not alone in my faith and move from 'God and me' to 'God and we?' On Divine Mercy Sunday, it can happen.
